NOTE: This charity can only fund organisations within the Parish of Fulbourn

Before filling in an application form please take note of the following:

Expand or contract the form sections as appropriate, it is the answers that matter!

Please apply on separate forms for 'one-off' and 'recurring' (ie repeating for 2 or 3 years - maximum) bids. This is even if they relate to the same project.

In making an application you accept that the trustees decision on your application is final. The trustees may ask for more information, and/or ask you to attend a meeting to answer questions.

If the funds will be used to provide services to children under 16 or vulnerable adults, you must outline the safeguarding measures that you have in place

The award of a grant is a contract, whereby you agree to promptly provide verification that the grant is spent correctly.

The trustees of Wright's Clock Land CIO expect applications for grants to come from organisations operating in the parish, rather than individuals. In cases of individual hardship or need please apply to one of the other village charities - see below. If in doubt please contact the Steward.

There are a number of other charities in Fulbourn:

Bishop's, Caraway's and Elizabeth March Charities – administered together as The Fulbourn Village Charities.

Ellen Weston's and Farmer's Charities – these are administered together via St Vigor's Church.

These village charities have for many years provided financial support, both direct and for educational needs, to individuals in the parish. They will continue to do this and individuals should continue to apply directly to them. These charities have their own much more modest sources of income, but should this be insufficient, Wright's will provide additional financial support to assist them. The trustees of Wright's and the other village charities, some of whom are joint trustees, do not wish to duplicate efforts and agree this is the best way for us to work together.
